A NOTE FROM MRS. AMAYA

Dear Families,

I want to congratulate and thank all our parent chaperones for a wonderful experience at Camp Arnold. We could not have done it without your willingness to spend three nights and four days with 90 middle school kids. It was, in my opinion, one of our best excursions. The food was good, the lodging was nice, and the view! Wow, the view took my breath away—it didn't hurt that the weather was spectacular. I am positive all the chaperones were exhausted, as were the teachers and kids, on Thursday. I am grateful to each of you for your dedication, flexibility, and patience while at camp. The students are writing reflections of their experiences of camp which they will share at our conferences.

Speaking of conferences, November is almost here. We have been in school for two months and your students are back in a routine. Even with our October camp break, students have made gains in their learning. November is the time when we lead the students through a series of lessons that help them set goals, both academic and social, for the year. Your student will share these goals, in addition to their progress and challenges thus far at RSAR, with you at our goal setting conferences. This year the conferences will be held the afternoons of November 29th and 30th. This is the week AFTER Thanksgiving. Students will be dismissed early from school those two days so that we can hold conferences. These are student led conferences—your child will

be leading the way and talking about the steps planned for the rest of the year. Teachers will be near to support and answer questions. Each year I am in awe of the interactions that occur between our students and parents. It is a chance for you to see what your child is learning and how he/she is growing. We hope that you will attend. Sign up forms and additional information will be sent out in the next two weeks.

The end of the first quarter is Tuesday, November 6th. All teachers have shared in each class that on Monday, October 29th any missing grade will be inputted with a score of 64. Don't panic! This does not mean the score will stay that way. It is way to elevate their level of concern. Once the assignment is turned in, the paper will be graded and recorded. No first quarter papers will be accepted after November 6th without prior teacher approval.

I am excited to announce that for the first time in Renaissance history we will be partaking in the "Battle of the Books." 6th grader Lisa Leite asked if we would be able to participate. To be honest, I didn't realize that middle school had the "Battle." After investigating and talking to the librarian in charge, we are in! Thank you, Lisa! Teams will be formed with in the next two weeks, with permission slips, as well as rules, sent home and posted on-line. There are 14 books total. I had read one already and plan to read all of them!

Finally, I would like to remind our community that any meetings, clubs, or use of our building should always be set up through Sarah Simmons, our office manager. This allows her to be aware and answer questions students may have about meetings and activities.

Thank you for all of you support. We are off to a fabulous year. I am grateful for the opportunity to work with your children.

LUNCH PROCEDURES

Students may purchase food in the Eastlake Commons cafeteria or bring their own lunches. Students can purchase lunch with cash or their student account. Adding money to student account: 1) use myschool bucks or 2) have student bring check to EHS kitchen cashier. RSAR DOES NOT ACCEPT THE LUNCH MONEY. If your student brings their own lunch be sure that they pack healthy foods. Please do not allow your student to bring soda or energy drinks.

STUDENT LAPTOPS

Trouble Connecting at Home

If your student is having difficulty connecting to your wireless network at home, please follow the steps below:

- a. Before you leave campus shut down your computer
 - i. This mean go to the Start Menu>Power Options>Select Shutdown
 - ii. If you do not shut down, then a restart will be needed at home before you try to connect to DirectAccess.
- b. When the student gets home, power on the laptop
- c. Connect to Home WiFi
- d. Then the student will need to wait about 1-5 minutes while the device connects to Direct Access.
 - i. If no connection is made with in 5 minutes, restart the laptop
 - ii. After the restart connect to home WiFi and let DirectAccess connect (allow the 1-5 minutes)

Laptop Insurance Options

Families may wish to protect against liability for lost, damaged or stolen property by reviewing their insurance options. Some homeowner's policy may offer coverage and some may offer this coverage if a rider is acquired. In addition, Lake Washington School District has arranged for an insurance option for families wishing to purchase a specific additional insurance to cover their student's laptop. This insurance can be purchased from Worth Insurance Group. The premium is \$63.60 per year and covers accidental damage and theft (police report required). The deductible in this policy is \$0. This insurance can be acquired directly by going to https://www.worthavegroup.com/portal/lakewashington. The company also offers coverage for other personal technology devices. If you chose not to purchase the optional insurance or do not otherwise have coverage, you will be responsible for fees for damaged or lost/stolen equipment as defined above.

STUDENT ABSENT/LATE ARRIVAL/EARLY DISMISSAL:

Students that are taking math over at EHS, if they are absent/late you will need to notify both RSAR and EHS about your students' absence.

Absences- An absence may only be excused within 48 hours. Parent/Guardian communication is required for excusing an absence or late arrival. You can email <u>sasimmons@lwsd.org</u> or leave a voicemail at (425) 936-1544. Please spell the last name of the student clearly and provide a reason for the absence/tardy.

Late Arrival- If your student is arriving to school late they need to check in at the office <u>before going to class</u>. You do not have to sign the student in but if the student does not stop by the office the absence put in by the teacher will NOT be changed into a TARDY and you will likely receive an attendance call.

Early Dismissal – Please come into the office and sign your student out. You do not need to call or email ahead of time. Please just come into the office, sign your student out and your student will be called out of class to leave with you. You must sign your student out in order for them to leave campus.
